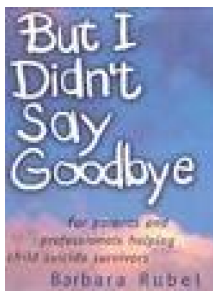


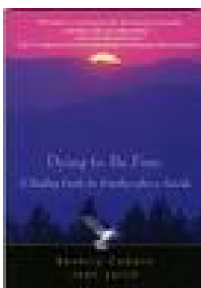

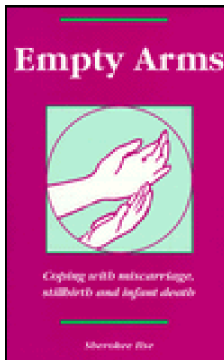


Dying To Be Free: A Healing Guide for Families After Suicide
